What is the "Multiply" Programme?

- ▶ A new programme being funded by the UK Government across the whole of the UK worth approx. £559 million over a 3 year period.
- ► Aims to improve numeracy skills through free personal tutoring, digital training and flexible courses.
- ► Target audience = adults aged 19 and over who do not have a GCSE Grade C or above (or equivalent) in maths.
- Individuals might be already working towards a maths qualification, need specific numeracy skills for their work or to progress or just want to brush up on skills to help them get on in life.

Budget - Mid Wales

- ► The Multiply budget is separate to the 'Core' SPF budget covering Communities and Place; Supporting Local Business; and People and Skills.
- ► For this financial year (23/24) and 24/25, Mid Wales has a budget allocation of approx. £5 million
- Approx 50% has been committed - still plenty left!
- ► The budget is ALL revenue no capital elements

Mutliply 'interventions' - 10 to choose from

Courses designed to increase confidence with numbers for those needing the first steps towards formal qualifications (W44)

Courses for parents wanting to increase their numeracy skills in order to help their children, and help with their own progression (W45)

Courses aimed at prisoners, those recently released from prison or on temporary licence (W46)

Courses aimed at people who can't apply for certain jobs because of lack of numeracy skills and/or to encourage people to upskill in order to access a certain job/career (W47)

Additional relevant maths modules embedded into other vocational courses (W48)

Mutliply 'interventions' - 10 to choose from

Innovative programmes delivered together with employers - including courses designed to cover specific numeracy skills required in the workplace (W49)

New intensive and flexible courses targeted at people without Level 2 maths in Wales, leading to an equivalent qualification (W50)

Courses designed to help people use numeracy to manage their money (W51)

Courses aimed at over 19s that are leaving, or have just left, the care system (W52)

Activities, courses or provision developed in partnership with community organisations and other partners aimed at engaging the hardest to reach learners - for example, those not in the labour market or other groups identified locally as in need (W53)



What outputs and outcomes are sought?

OUTPUTS:

- Number of adult numeracy courses run through Multiply
- Number of people participating in Multiply funded courses
- ► Number of people achieving a qualification
- Number of courses developed in collaboration with employers
- Number of people referred from partners onto upskill courses
- Number of different cohorts participating in numeracy courses



What outputs and outcomes are sought?

OUTCOMES:

- Number of adults achieving maths qualifications up to and including Level 2 equivalent
- Number of adults participating in maths qualifications and courses up to and including Level 2 equivalent
- ► ALSO UK Gov is interested in the PROGRESS / DIFFERENCE made to an individual's confidence (learner progression)

What does Multiply look like in practice?
